CONFERENCE RATES

Due to the generous support from the BC Ministry of Aboriginal Relations and Reconciliation (MARR), Counselling Foundation of Canada (CFC) and our other sponsors we able to cover the registration, material, accommodation and food costs for 20 Aboriginal Youth and Aboriginal Youth Workers on a first come first serve basis with priority given to UAYC, ANYEN (BCAYWN) and YouLEAD Advisors with limited travel subsides available as well. The value of this offer is \$2000.

For those not eligible for this coverage we are asking for a modest fee of \$450 to cover the cost of the AOH registration, materials, lodging and food with limited subsidies available.

There are also a limited number of bursaries for those unable to access funding for training and/or travel. These bursaries must be applied for and will be awarded on a first come first serve basis with priority given to aboriginal youth workers and UAYC members.
